World History, Culture, & Geography

This course is designed to prepare students for college. It includes a social, political, economic, and cultural survey of humanity from 1500 AD to the present.

Advanced World History Culture, & Geography Economics

This course is designed to look at historical issues from the World History course on a deeper level. It includes a social, political, economic, and cultural survey of humanity from 1500 AD to the present, with greater emphasis on the ideological changes throughout World History.

This course is designed to introduce students to basic economic concepts, comparative economic systems, elements of economic systems, elemental economic growth and change, and consumer skills.

U.S. Government

This course is designed to give students a better understanding of the institutions of American government. They will analyze the life and changing interpretations of the Constitution, the Bill of Rights and the current state of the three branches of government.

Advanced Placement U.S. Government

This course is designed to give students an analytical perspective on politics and government in the U.S. It involves both the study of general concepts used to interpret U.S. politics and the analysis of specific case studies. It also requires familiarity with the various institutions, groups, beliefs, and ideas that constitute U.S. political reality.



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Advanced Placement Psychology

This course will examine the four main goals of psychology. These goals are to describe, explain, predict and control mental processes & behavior. The course includes studying and discussing personality differences, nature versus nurture, group tendencies and much, much more. We will undergo research projects that will allow students to analyze and synthesize evidence both quantitatively and qualitatively. The first semester of the course highlights the background & history of the field of psychology, consciousness, personality and development over the life span. The second semester of the course highlights human interactions with society including attitudes and social influences as well as the assessment and treatment of disorders.

U.S. History

This course is designed to begin with the present cultural heritage and trace these back to their origin in the past. Using a concept approach, emphasis will be placed on the political, social, economic, and judicial development of our nation with particular attention to the 20th century.
